The neighborhood association was organized to improve the safety, security, and appearance of our neighborhood, and to continually strive toward the development of a community-wide spirit of unity and cooperation, thus creating a better quality of life for all our neighbors, and to establishing and maintain an open line of communication and liaison among the neighborhood government agencies, police, and other neighborhoods. The association provides an open process by which all the members of the neighborhood may involve themselves in the affairs of the neighborhood. Dorothy and Bill DeGraffenreid were the core leaders in getting the neighborhood association organized and are still very involved. Dorothy is the Association historian and Bill served on the Executive Committee until last year. Bill Holsey was the first president and held that position until May, 2006. The Neighborhood Association has accomplished a lot in the last 10 years. The largest by putting together a plan to solve the flooding problem at Five Points, and to build a Shelter House at Lorraine Park. Lorraine Park Neighborhood Association is the second neighborhood in the city to have a Community Emergency Response Team. The Team strapped down water heaters for homeowners in our neighborhood to insure safety in the event of a disaster. Established the "Yard of the Month" award recognizing homeowners with the most visible home or lawn improvements. These are just a few of the association accomplishments.
